The second quarter of the year has been a mixed bag for us at Hockey India as both the teams finished fourth at the Gold Coast 2018 XXI Commonwealth Games in Australia. However, the Women's team was quick to make sure that they prepare well for the upcoming World Cup as they won the Silver Medal in the Women's Asian Champions Trophy 2018. The team was also successful in their recently concluded Spain Tour where they continued to build momentum. I am pleased with the recent results of the team and am very hopeful that they will make the nation proud in England.

Our Men's team has also been raising the expectations of the fans as they performed well and had a great outing in the Rabobank Hockey Men's Champions Trophy Breda 2018, bringing home a Silver Medal. The Junior teams will also be on their voyage to Belgium where the Junior Men's Team will play a Five Nations Tournament while the Junior Women's team will play a Six Nations Tournament in Antwerp. Hockey India was also honoured to have organised a Hockey 5-a-side Exhibition Match for the International Olympic Committee President Dr Thomas Bach, who was on a three-day visit to our country in mid-April. We are extremely privileged to have hosted the IOC delegation to an exciting and fast-paced match which saw some our star-players take the field. One of the players who displayed his skills on the turf was the experienced Sardar Singh, who has recently completed 300 International Caps for the country. It is a proud feeling to have been blessed with a player of Sardar's calibre. I would like to wish him and all the players the very best in the coming few months as we look to make the country proud.






















HOCKEY INDIA ANNOUNCED P.R. SREEJESH AND RANI AS CAPTAINS UNTIL END OF YEAR



INDIAN WOMEN'S HOCKEY TEAM LOST 0-1 TO AUSTRALIA IN SEMI-FINAL OF CWG 2018





INDIAN WOMEN'S HOCKEY TEAM LOOKED TO START SPAIN TOUR ON A POSITIVE NOTE

The Indian Women's Hockey team started their Spain Tour on 12 June 2018, as they faced the hosts in the opening match of the five-matches at the Consejo Superior de Deportes Hockey Stadium.

The World No. 10 team was led by Captain Rani, who returned to the team after having been rested for the recently concluded 5th Women's Asian Champions Trophy held in South Korea.









SPAIN DEFEATED THE INDIAN WOMEN'S HOCKEY TEAM 3-0 IN THE FIRST MATCH

The opening match of the five matches between Indian Women's Hockey Team and Spain on 12th April saw the hosts register a 3-0 victory. The second match of the five matches between the Indian Women's Hockey Team and Spain ended in a 1-1 draw at the Consejo Superior de Deportes Hockey Stadium on 13th June 2018. It was a match of two halves as hosts Spain dominated the match in the first two quarters but the Indian team made a comeback in the latter two quarters. It was Spain's Berta Bonastre (14') who opened the scoring but India's Anupa Barla cancelled out her goal in the 54th minute which meant that the match ended in a well-fought draw.

However, Lola Riera continued her fine goal-scoring form for the hosts, equalising in the 58th minute through a well-taken penalty corner. But it was India's Captain Rani who popped up in the 59th minute to score a wonderful field goal and give her side a well deserved 3-2 win.

On 16th June, The Indian Women's Hockey team slipped to a 1-4 defeat to hosts Spain in the fourth match of their Spain Tour. Lola Riera (10', 34') continued her fine form as she scored twice in her team's victory and was helped by goals from Lucia Jimenez (19') and Carmen Cano (37'). India's only goal of the match was scored by Nikki Pradhan in the 22nd minute.





INDIAN WOMEN'S HOCKEY TEAM END SPAIN TOUR ON A HIGH, DEFEAT THE HOSTS 4-1 IN 5TH MATCH

The Indian Women's Hockey team ended their Spain Tour on a bright note as they defeated the hosts 4-1 in the fifth and final match on 18th June. 






INDIAN MEN'S HOCKEY TEAM STUN NETHERLANDS WITH 1-1 DRAW







HOCKEY INDIA CONGRATULATED SARDAR SINGH ON COMPLETING 300 INTERNATIONAL CAPS FOR INDIA


