

Playing in front of an energetic crowd, after going down by 2 goals from Rajasthan scored by Shivam & Romit Pal, Assam Hockey made a fantastic comeback to win the Finals of the National Championship with a score line of 3-2. 

Resilient Indian Women's Hockey Team defeated South Korea 1-0 in the first match of South Korea Tour (March 05)

Indian Women's Hockey Team started their tour of South Korea with a morale-boosting 1-0 win over the hosts in the first match of the five match series at the Jinchun National Athletic Center on 5th March where a 5th minute goal from Lalremsiami contributed to the victory.

She made her International debut in 2008 at the Olympic Qualifiers held in Kazan, Russia. After representing India at 2010 Commonwealth Games and 2010 Asian Games, Rani was included in the FIH Women's All Star Team of 2010. She was also included in the All Star team of the Asian Hockey Federation based on her performance in 2010 Asian Games at Guangzhou.



8th March 2018, the third match of Indian Women's Hockey Team Tour of Korea saw yet another milestone with Midfielder Monika completing 100 International caps. The 24-year-old Midfielder, who made her International debut in 2012 against New Zealand in Naples, has been an integral part of the Indian Women's Hockey Team.

How to help freshers/ umpires to identify areas to be worked on for improvement, was another significant area that was spoken of. While there were many more areas that were discussed, this programme will undoubtedly help in my growth and I also applied all that I learnt here in my recent stint at the Men's Asian Games qualifying in Oman, stated Ripudaman.

The AHF-FIH Academy Umpire Manager Seminar from 6 March to 8 March 2018 was attended by Mr Javed Shaikh and Mr Gandham Harshavardhan from India.



in six tournaments as an Umpire Manager, including the 7th Hockey India National Championships held last year.


