

HOCKEY INDIA CONDUCTED ONLINE TEST FOR UMPIRES AND TECHNICAL OFFICIALS

Hockey India successfully conducted the first-ever Indian Online Test for Umpires and Technical Officials. A record 873 candidates from across India appeared for the Test that began at 1100 hours and concluded at 1300 hours on 29 March 2019.

This online Test was designed as part of a program for professional development of the Umpires and Technical Officials. It received an unprecedented response and hopeful they will receive more participation in the future programs too.

The Test revolved around practical and theoretical knowledge of the FIH Rules of Hockey 2019 and the current FIH Tournament Regulations.





HOCKEY INDIA COACHING EDUCATION PATHWAY LAUNCHED

In an endeavour to develop Coaches from the grassroots and enable them to meet the requirements and the ever-growing demands of International hockey, the sports' governing body in India has launched their ambitious Hockey India Coaching Education Pathway.

The meticulously-designed program aims to provide certification to those candidates who are already Coaches or wish to pursue Coaching as a career option. This simplified education structure will provide certification to develop Coaches from grassroots through to a high performance/ International level. The program consists of a combination of web-based modules and face-to-face interactive courses, underpinned by a competency based assessment process.

Those candidates who successfully complete the Hockey India Level '0', Hockey India Level '1' and Hockey India Level '2' Coaching Courses will be eligible to enrol for the FIH Academy Level 1 Course provisionally scheduled during the FIH Men's Series Finals Bhubaneswar Odisha 2019.




