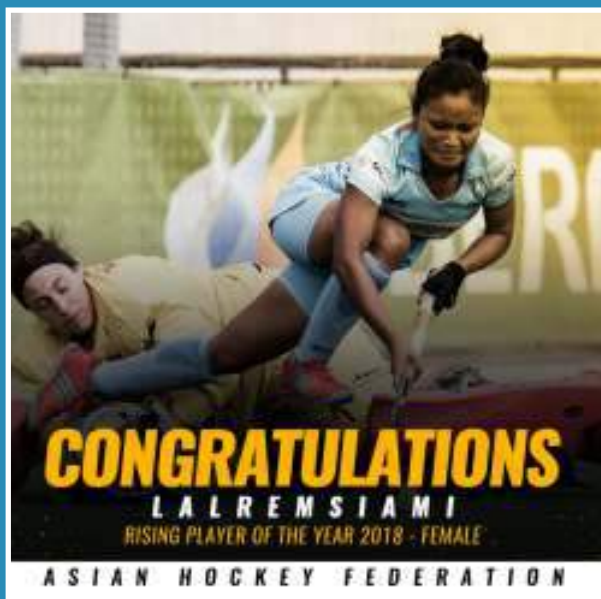

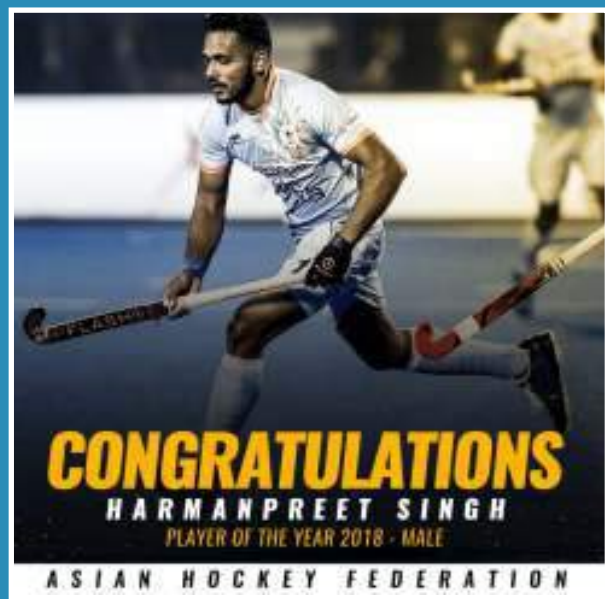

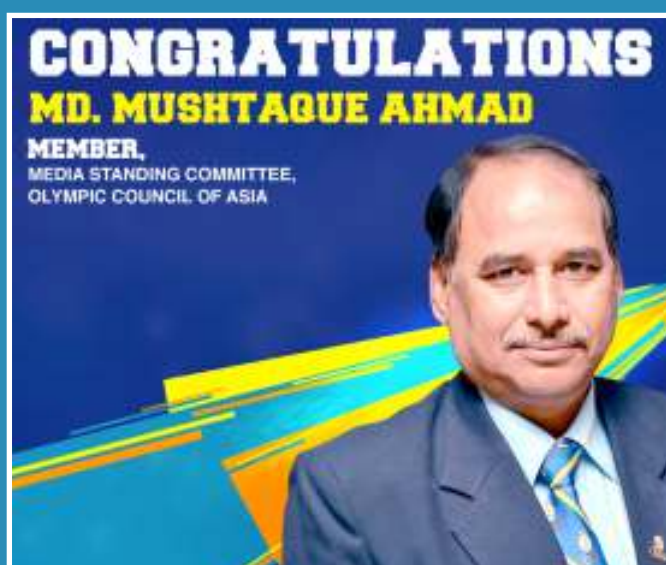

The last date for submission of registration fee for HI Level '0', HI level '1' Course was 26 March 2019 by 1700 hours.
