

## Hockey India introduces Open Application & Registration system for Players

Hockey India, which has utilized the Hockey India Member Unit Portal since September 2019 to manage all their important documentation, registration of players, player transfers, national championships, Hockey India Coaching Education Pathway, registration of coaches and technical officials, have introduced some new key features to the Hockey India Member Unit Portal. The Hockey India Member Unit Portal is a major step towards going paperless and making data easily accessible. All the activities carried out by all Hockey India Member Units are documented on the Portal.

On 07 January 2021, Hockey India introduced an open application and registration process for players under various categories, similar to the open application and registration process for Coaches and Technical Officials. Any hockey player across the country can submit their application for further approval of Hockey India Registered Member Unit to register as a player through the Hockey India Member Unit Portal.





## South Africa's Gregg Clark appointed as new Analytical Coach for Indian Men's Hockey Team

Olympian Gregg Clark has been appointed as the new Analytical Coach of the Indian Men's Hockey team until the conclusion of the Tokyo Olympic Games scheduled to be held from 23 July to 8 August 2021. The South African who was formerly associated with the Canadian Men's Hockey Team as Assistant Coach between 2017-2020 has joined the National Coaching Camp in early January 2021.

Clark in his 11-year long career as a hockey player for the South African national team has 250 international caps and has appeared in two World Cups ('94 - Sydney & '02 - Kuala Lumpur), two Commonwealth Games ('98 - Kuala Lumpur & '02 - Manchester) and two Olympic Games ('96 - Atlanta & '04 - Athens). Gregg Clark comes to India with over 13 years of Coaching experience and his first big assignment came as Head Coach in 2007 when he took charge of the South African National team and worked with them from 2007 - 2013. Clark also participated as a Coach at a number of major international tournaments including the Olympic Games in Beijing and London, FIH World Cup 2010 and Commonwealth Games 2010 in New Delhi.

A confident and satisfied looking Indian Junior Women's Hockey Team returned to the country's national capital in the early hours of 27 January 2021 after remaining unbeaten in their Tour of Chile. The team landed in New Delhi after having won five out of the six matches they played during their Tour of Chile, with one match ending in a draw.

The Indian team had started the tour by playing two matches against the Chile Junior Women's Team, both of which ended in India's favour with score-lines of 5-3 and 4-2 respectively. The two wins in the opening matches were backed by three wins in four matches against the Chile Senior team. With score-lines of 3-2, 2-0 and 2-1, India registered three wins against the experienced Chilean team, with their second of the four matches ending in a 2-2 draw.

Indian Women's Hockey Team put up a determined performance to end their campaign in Argentina with a 1-1 draw on 31 January 2021. It was Skipper Rani who struck for India in the 35th minute while Emilia Forcherio scored for the home team through a penalty stroke.

This was India's fourth scheduled match against the World No. 2 ranked side after the third match to be played on Saturday was abandoned due to incessant rains. Earlier in the tour, India had drawn 2-2, 1-1 against the Argentina Junior team and lost 1-2, 2-3 to Argentina 'B' team. Against the Argentina Senior side, India lost 2-3 and 0-2 in the first and second matches.

After the successful organization of the Hockey India Coaching Education Pathway Level 'Basic' Coaching Course (online) in September/ October and December last year, Hockey India once again called for applications of interested and aspiring Coaches to apply through an open forum and only

70 slots were available for the online course, which was held on 13 February 2021 and 15 February 2021.

Since the launch of Hockey India Coaching Education Pathway in 2019, over 800 coaches from across India have benefitted from the programme which is a simplified education structure that consists of a combination of web-based modules and face-to-face interactive courses, underpinned by a competency-based assessment process, which helps the Coaches in progressing to higher levels.

## Hockey India pays tribute to Olympic Bronze Medallist and World Cup winner Michael Kindo

Hockey India expressed their deepest condolences on the sad demise of former India hockey player Michael Kindo, who breathed his last breath on 31 December 2020 in Rourkela. The Olympic Bronze Medallist and World Cup winner was bed-ridden for quite some time before he passed away at the age of 73 due to age-related ailments.

Kindo, who was part of India's 1975 hockey World Cup-winning and 1972 Olympics Bronze medal winning teams, was conferred with the Arjuna Award in 1972. The Defender contributed to India clinching the Bronze Medal at the 1972 Olympics by scoring three goals as well.

Kindo, who passed away at the Ispat General Hospital, is survived by his wife, a son and two daughters.

## Asian Hockey Federation (AHF) continue to conduct Online Education Workshops exclusively for Hockey India Coaches, Umpires and Technical Officials



After the successful completion of the AHF Online Education Workshops exclusively for the Hockey India Coaches, Umpires and Technical Officials in each of the six months prior to January, the Asian Hockey Federation (AHF) conducted another set of Online Education Workshops during the course of this month. A group of 12-30 Coaches, Umpires and Technical Officials attended seven AHF Online Education Workshops in January.

Aimed at providing technical expertise and knowledge on various aspects of power & strength training and method of video analysis for Coaches, communication for Umpires and officiating for Technical Officials, these online education workshops were conducted free of cost, consisting of a three to four hours' sessions each.

## Indian Men's Hockey Team set to play matches against the National team of Germany and Great Britain

After a year since they last played an international match, the Indian Men's Hockey Team are scheduled to play two matches each against the Germany and Great Britain national teams during their 17-day tour of Europe.

Playing their first international match in over 12 months, the Indian Men's Hockey Team led by PR Sreejesh put up a scintillating show as they outclassed hosts Germany 6-1 in the first of their four-match Europe Tour on Sunday, 28 February 2021. India's goal scorers were Nilakanta Sharma (13'), Vivek Sagar Prasad (27', 27'), Lalit Kumar Upadhyay (41'), Akashdeep Singh (42') and Harmanpreet Singh (47'), who outplayed the hosts and led their team to a winning start in their first assignment of 2021.

The 22-member squad left from Bengaluru for Krefeld, Germany on 21st February 2021. The national side will play its second match against Germany on 2nd March 2021. They will then travel to Antwerp, Belgium where they are scheduled to play against Great Britain team on 6th March and 8th March 2021.

The entire Indian contingent underwent a Covid-19 RT-PCR Test 48 hours prior to their entry in Germany. The team will be following all safety and health measures as advised by the respective Governments of India, Germany and Belgium during their tour. ## Indian Women's Hockey Team set to play four matches against the National team of Germany

After their tour of Argentina where the Indian Women's Hockey Team played a total of 7 matches, the Rani-led squad has traveled to Dusseldorf, Germany to play four matches against their National squad as part of their preparations for the Tokyo Olympic Games. The 18 members squad left for Dusseldorf on 23 February 2021 from Bengaluru.

The Indian Women's Hockey Team went down 0-5 and 0-1 to the World No. 3 Germany side in their first two matches of the four-match tour on 27 February 2021 and 28 February 2021 respectively.

## Hon'ble Chief Minister of Odisha laid foundation stone of country's largest hockey stadium in Rourkela

The Hon'ble Chief Minister of Odisha Shri Naveen Patnaik, on 16 February 2021, laid the foundation stone for the new world-class Hockey stadium to be constructed in Rourkela city which would be the biggest stadium for Hockey in India with a chair seated capacity of 20,000. The name of stadium will be Birsa Munda International Hockey Stadium, Rourkela.

The stadium is set to have all the modern facilities and will offer a unique experience to players and the fans during the FIH Odisha Men's Hockey World Cup 2023 Bhubaneswar and Rourkela. The work to develop synthetic hockey turf in each of the 17 blocks of Sundargarh district has also already begun. In 2023, the hockey-loving nation will host the

competition for a record fourth time since its inception in 1971. The FIH Odisha Men's Hockey World Cup 2023 Bhubaneswar and Rourkela is slated to be held in Bhubaneswar and Rourkela from 13 January 2023 to 29 January 2023. The FIH Odisha Men's Hockey World Cup 2023 Bhubaneswar and Rourkela being hosted in India holds great significance since India will be completing 75 years of independence in 2023.

The host federation Hockey India did not want to miss out on the opportunity to showcase the growth of the sport in the country in this landmark year and give the country another reason to celebrate 75 years of independence.



**Birsa Munda International Hockey Stadium, Rourkela**

When India hosted the 14th edition of Odisha Men's Hockey World Cup Bhubaneswar in 2018, all the matches of the competition were held at the Kalinga Hockey Stadium in Bhubaneswar, but two venues will be utilized for the FIH Men's Hockey World Cup in 2023 – Bhubaneswar and Rourkela.



"We are aiming to complete all the work required for hosting a successful FIH Odisha Men's Hockey World Cup 2023 Bhubaneswar and Rourkela by mid-2022. The upcoming World Cup is expected to be even bigger than the one in 2018. It will be a challenge and an opportunity for us to organize the 2023 World Cup in two venues – Bhubaneswar and Rourkela. Since the World Cup in 2018 was held at the Kalinga Hockey Stadium in Bhubaneswar, most of the arrangements are in place in Bhubaneswar, while a new world-class Hockey stadium is being built in Rourkela.



World-class infrastructure at both venues will enable Odisha to once again deliver a successful and memorable tournament and leave behind a valuable and lasting legacy," said Hon'ble Minister for Sports and Youth Services, Odisha, Shri. Tusharkanti Behera.

Speaking on the preparations for the FIH Odisha Men's Hockey World Cup 2023 Bhubaneswar and



Rourkela, Mr. Gyanendra Ningombam, President, Hockey India, said "It's an absolute honour for us to host the Men's Hockey World Cups back-to-back. After hosting a successful World Cup in 2018, we are going to ensure that the FIH Odisha Men's Hockey World Cup 2023 Bhubaneswar and Rourkela will have even better facilities for the players and the fans. It's very exciting to note that we are exactly two years away from the 2023 World Cup."

India has hosted some of the biggest hockey competitions in recent years including the FIH Hero Men's Champions Trophy 2014, FIH Men's Hockey World League Final Raipur 2015, FIH Uttar Pradesh Hockey Junior World Cup Men Lucknow 2016, FIH Odisha Men's Hockey World League Final Bhubaneswar 2017, FIH Odisha Hockey Men's World Cup Bhubaneswar 2018, FIH Men's Series Finals Bhubaneswar Odisha 2019 and the FIH Hockey Olympic Qualifiers Odisha (Men and Women) in 2019. Smooth organization, world-class facilities, and the success of these tournaments have made India one of the major centres for hockey in the world. India will become the first country ever to host four Men's Hockey World Cups in 2023, after having hosted the Men's Hockey World Cups in 1982 (Mumbai), 2010 (New Delhi) and 2018 (Bhubaneswar). The national side will be looking to win the coveted title after their last win in 1975.

## Hockey India announce dates for Annual National Championships

After working closely with the State Member Units over the past few months to ensure hockey activities resume in their respective states, Hockey India has now announced the dates for the 11th Hockey India Sub Junior Women National Championship 2021, 11th Hockey India Sub Junior Men National Championship 2021, 11th Hockey India Junior Women National Championship 2021 as well as the 1st Hockey India Sub Junior Women Academy National Championship 2021 and 1st Hockey India Junior Women Academy National Championship 2021.

Kicking off the domestic calendar this year will be the 11th Hockey India Sub Junior Women National Championship 2021 which will be held in Simdega, Jharkand from 10 March to 18 March 2021. The 11th Hockey India Sub Junior Men National Championship 2021 will be held in Jind, Haryana starting from 17 March to 25 March 2021. 11th Hockey India Junior Women National

Championship 2021 will be held in Simdega, Jharkand from 3 April to 12 April 2021.

The inaugural edition of 1st Hockey India Junior Women Academy National Championship 2021 will be held in Bhubaneswar, Odisha from 17 March 2021 to 26 March 2021 and 1st Hockey India Sub Junior Women Academy National Championship 2021 will be held in Bhubaneswar, Odisha between 17 March 2021 to 24 March 2021.

The National Championships will be resuming after a span of one year. In 2020, the 10th Hockey India Senior Men and Senior Women Championship 2020 (A Division) as well as the 10th Hockey India Senior Women National Championship 2020 (B Division) were held earlier in the year while the remaining National Championships were canceled.

To ensure safety of players as well as technical officials taking part in this year's annual National Championships, Hockey India has laid special emphasis on following the Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) issued by the federation to all the participating teams and host states. "We are delighted to announce the dates for the Annual National Championships. Though we had to cancel the remaining National Championships for the year 2020, we are happy that all state member units who are participating in 2021 have resumed activities and are able to prepare their teams for the forthcoming National Championships," expressed Gyanendro Ningombam, President, Hockey India.

He further stated that Hockey India officials were in constant touch with the State Member Units to ensure activities have resumed in a smooth, systematic way. "Since the MHA guidelines allowed resumption of sporting activities in September last year, the Hockey India officials have been in constant touch with State Member Units and affiliated Academies encouraging them to resume activities. We extend our gratitude towards all the host state who have agreed to hold the competitions despite challenging circumstances," he added.

The dates for the remaining National Championships for 2021 will also be announced once there is confirmation from all participating states and academies.

Having made his senior India debut at the Olympic Test Event in Tokyo in 2019, young midfielder Shamsher Singh had many things to look forward in the year 2020. His single most important mission was to prove his worth to the team to find a place in the squad for key events last year but the pandemic derailed his plans, however did little to dent his spirit.

"I have come from a difficult background with my father making his living from farming. There were several odds that I faced in my initial days in hockey and the struggle for basics like stick, kit and shoes were real. I believe this past experience helped me brace for any uncertain circumstances and this year we have all been put off gear with the pandemic but what's important is to continue to stay focused on our goals no matter the odds," stated the 23-year-old from Attari who climbed the ranks in domestic hockey after honing his skills at the Surjit Singh Academy in Jalandhar, Punjab where several of his teammates come from.

Shamsher's debut for the Indian team was quite memorable as they won the tournament by beating New Zealand 5-0 in the Final, a match which saw Shamsher score his first Senior Team goal for the country. He struck the 2nd goal for India in the 18th minute. The talented youngster played all four of India's games - 6-0 win over Malaysia, 2-1 loss to New Zealand, 6-3 win against hosts Japan and 5-0 win against New Zealand in the Final.

"I wanted to build on my game further and was hopeful of finding opportunities in key events that were to be held this year. But with the scenario changing due to the pandemic, I have realigned my focus to make the most of the situation by improving my basics and gain experience by closely working with seniors in the team. The learnings during this time has been of immense value," he added.

Shamsher's disappointment in 2016 when he missed out on making the team for the FIH Junior Men's World Cup was a turning point in his career, explains the young lad. He said, "I was part of the reserves but missed out on making the cut for the Indian squad that went on to win the coveted Junior World Cup. It was magical to watch the team lift the title in front of crazy hockey fans in Lucknow and watching the entire tournament from the sidelines only made me more determined to work hard and earn the India jersey. Now in the Senior Core probable group, my aim is to become a dependable player for the team and execute what's expected of me from the Coach."

Shamsher Singh is currently part of the National Coaching Camp, which began in Sports Authority of India (SAI), Bengaluru on 5 January 2021.

Having scored four goals in five matches, Sangita said that it was a great feeling to contribute to the team's success, especially after a long hiatus due to an ACL injury and the pandemic situation.

"I was playing after quite a long time as I had an injury in 2019, and then due to COVID, everything came to a grinding halt. It was a great feeling to be back and contribute to the side's winning cause. All credit to the coaching staff and teammates for all the support and trust, which helped me deliver," expressed Sangita.

Indian Junior eves won five out of six matches while one ended in a draw. Commenting about the team's performance, she added, "We did really well in Chile, despite not getting any competitions in 2020 due to the pandemic. We had trained really hard at the camp for the tour, and it has paid off."

The Jharkhand-born first came in the limelight during the 2016 Girls U18 Asia Cup, where she scored eight goals and helped the team clinch the Bronze medal. She was also a part of the Hockey Jharkhand team which won the 9th Hockey India Junior Women National Championship 2019 (A Div).



"I think winning the Nationals for Jharkhand in 2019 was a big highlight for me and a very satisfying victory.



We were quickly recognized for this feat by getting a call-up for the Junior Women's National Coaching Camp. My journey since then has been quite eventful and I am working hard on improving my game," she said.

Having featured in six international-level competitions before, the Jharkhand-born is now aiming for the Junior Women's Asia Cup, which is scheduled for August this year in Kakamigahara, Japan. "We have begun our training in SAI, and I definitely think the Chile tour has boosted our confidence. Hopefully, we can continue the same run of form at the camp and hopefully at the Junior Women's Asia Cup as well," she signed-off.

## Indian Hockey Teams return to Action!

After nearly a year since they last played an international match, the Indian Women's Hockey Team traveled to Argentina for their first tour of the Olympic year 2021. The team competed in 8 matches against the host nation from 17 January 2021 to 31 January 2021, while the Indian Junior Women's Hockey Team traveled to Chile for their much-needed preparations for the all-important Junior World Cup this year. The team took on the Junior Chile Team on 17 January 2021 and 18 January 2021 before going up against the Senior Chile Team on 20 January 2021, 21 January 2021, 23 January 2021 and 24 January 2021.

This was the first time that the Indian Hockey team preparing for the Olympic Games received government sanction to travel for an international assignment after the pandemic hit and halted all National & International



competitions around the world abruptly.

In the past few months, Hockey India has been meticulously planning, in coordination with a number of countries to ensure international competitions for the Indian teams as part of their preparations for the Tokyo Olympic Games which were postponed from July 2020 to July 2021 and other major international tournaments in the year 2021.





It's been the Federation's top priority to ensure the best interest of the teams to receive necessary match practice in a safe environment after the kind of year 2020 was where hardly any tournaments were held due to the pandemic hit year.

The Indian Men's Hockey Team also returned to action in February with matches against Germany and Great Britain. The members of the team have been eager to showcase their skills in an international match and the tour of Europe presented the perfect opportunity for the team to do so.

## **Positive step in Senior Women's Team's preparation for Olympics**

The exposure tour of Argentina saw the Indian core group register 2-2, 1-1 draws against the Argentina Junior team and lost 1-2, 2-3 to Argentina 'B' team before a 2-3, 0-2 loss to the World No.2 senior side. In the last scheduled match on 31 January 2021, the Indian team led by Rani held Argentina to a 1-1 draw.

The Indian Women's Hockey Team on the other hand went for their second tour this year to Germany in February. The team is moving from strength to strength with each international match.

The Men's tour of Europe is being held between 21st February 2021 and 9th March 2021, while the Women's tour of Germany is being held between 23rd February 2021 to 05 March 2021.

"In all three matches against the Senior Women, it was very closely contested, and the matches could have gone either way. Even the match where we lost 0-2, they (Argentina) were very effective, but our quality of play was very high in that game. Overall, this tour has helped us gain that confidence of playing against a top side like Argentina.

We had the chance to experience what it takes to beat a team like Argentina and the areas we need to focus on to succeed against a quality side.

This is a positive step in our preparations for the Olympic Games," expressed Chief Coach Sjoerd Marijne.



## Successful tour for Indian Junior Women's Team

A confident and satisfied looking Indian Junior Women's Hockey Team returned to the country's national capital on 27 January 2021 after remaining unbeaten in their Tour of Chile. The team landed at the Indira Gandhi International Airport after having won five out of the six matches they played during their Tour of Chile, with one match ending in a draw.

"We are very happy to have got the opportunity to resume competitive hockey after the pandemic. It was a very good experience for all the players and members of the support staff and it gives us huge confidence as we approach an important year ahead," expressed Suman Devi Thoudam, who served as the Captain of the Indian Junior Women's Hockey Team.





## Robust bio-bubble to ensure safety

Hockey India and the host National Associations created a bio bubble in Argentina, Chile, Germany and Belgium for the players and support staff of all the teams on their respective tours. Separate halls are being provided to the teams for all the meals, team meetings, sessions etc. And the accommodation for the Indian contingent has been on a twin sharing basis, where the room sharing partners remain the same throughout the tour. Every small detail is being planned carefully keeping in mind all necessary requirements.

The team members are not being allowed to move out of the bubble and meet any third-party source and even while travelling to the match/training venue the teams travel in a

dedicated transport which only take upto 80% capacity. The local resources along with the team including Team bus/coach, drivers, support staff remains the same throughout the tour to avoid any lapses in the protocols with regard to the safety of the team.

The entire Indian contingent of the Senior Men's and Women's, and Junior Women's Teams underwent a Covid-19 RT-PCR Test 72 hours prior to their departure from India. All the teams had to follow all safety and health measures as advised by the respective Governments of India on all of their tours. Further, the teams also followed/following the Hockey India SOPs as available on the Hockey India website.

## Former Indian hockey players undertake Hockey India Coaching Education Pathway Level '1' Coaching Course 2021



A host of former Indian international players, which included Dr AB Subbaiah (Arjuna Awardee), Sabu Varkey (Olympian), Davinder Kumar (1998 Senior World Cup), Virender Singh (1997 Junior World Cup Silver Medalist), Dipika Murty (2006 World Cup) and Deepika (Arjuna Awardee, Olympian), undertook the Hockey India Coaching Education Pathway Level '1' Coaching Course 2021, which took place in New Delhi from 29 January 2021 to 1 February 2021 and in Bhubaneswar from 3 February 2021 to 6 February 2021.

The Hockey India Coaching Education Pathway Level '1' Coaching Course, which was organized after almost one year, saw over 100 candidates from

various parts of the country undertaking the course. This was the first Coaching Course conducted on-ground since the Covid-19 pandemic began in March last year.

Speaking on participating in the Hockey India Coaching Education Pathway Level '1' Coaching Course 2021, Arjuna Awardee Dr AB Subbaiah said, "The Coaching Education Pathway started by Hockey India is a very good program. I recommend all the young aspiring coaches of India, who want to pick up coaching seriously, to undergo the Hockey India Coaching Education Pathway Level '1' Coaching Course.

This is where one can learn all the modern techniques from the very experienced national coaches as well as former players, who have undergone FIH level coaching courses."

Olympian and Arjuna Awardee Deepika said that she has learned how to utilize her experience as a player to coach young players at the grassroots level.



"I have learned a lot through the Hockey India Coaching Education Pathway. I have learned how to utilize my experience and passion to coach players at the grassroots level. I would like to thank Hockey India for starting the Hockey India Coaching Education Pathway for experienced players like us," said Deepika.

Senior Women's World Cup (2006 and 2010) player Dipika Murty expressed that she learned a very important coaching technique at the Hockey India Coaching Education Pathway Level '1' Coaching Course 2021, "One important thing that I have learned through the coaching sessions is that I would like to get down to the level of the players that we are coaching, focus on the minute details, teach them and explain them properly, and also get feedback from them."

Davinder Kumar, 1998 Senior Men's World Cup player, said that he learned effective coaching methods through the coaching course, "My experience at the Hockey India Coaching Education Pathway Level '1' Coaching Course has been fantastic. It has given me a chance to learn new ways of coaching which are better and more effective, which we can impart to our youngsters, which helps in the growth of hockey."

While speaking about his biggest learning from the Hockey India Coaching Education Pathway Level '1' Coaching Course, Virender Singh, Silver Medallist - 1997 Junior Men's World Cup said, "The future hockey players have to be groomed at the grassroots level itself and that's what I got to learn here as a coach. I have really liked learning this through the Hockey India Coaching Education Pathway Level '1' Coaching Course."

Each of the candidates' competencies were assessed and only those candidates who successfully completed the Hockey India Level '1' Coaching Course on the basis of the assessment criteria, were provided the necessary certification.

Since the launch of the Hockey India Coaching Education Pathway in 2019, over 800 coaches from across India have benefitted from the programme which is a simplified education structure that consists of a combination of web-based modules and face-to-face interactive courses, underpinned by a competency-based assessment process, which helps the Coaches in progressing to higher levels.

HICEP aims to help in developing coaches from the grassroots level into world-class coaches of the high performance/international level. Once a candidate progresses from the Hockey India Coaching Education Pathway, they are then eligible to enrol for the FIH Academy Level 1 Course, and so on.





Having made her Senior Team debut in 2017, attacking midfielder Udita made rapid strides with opportunities to showcase her talent in big-ticket events such as the 2018 Asian Games and 2018 FIH Women's World Cup among other major events. Now, she has pinned her focus on the Olympic Games in Tokyo this year and believes the next five months is going to be the most crucial time of her career. "I have been very fortunate to have got an opportunity to play for India in some

of the biggest events like the Asian Games and the World Cup in London where we had some significant performances as a team. Now, the entire team has only one focus and that is the Olympic Games in Tokyo. There is no doubt that the next few months is going to be the most crucial time of our lives and everything we do; it will be with an aim to produce the best results in Tokyo," stated the youngster from Hisar, Haryana.

Udita first broke into the national scene when she was selected for the Junior National Camp in 2015 following impressive performances in domestic tournaments. Having debuted for the Junior India team in 2016, she went on to Captain the junior India squad that won the Bronze at the 4th U-18 Women's Asia Cup in 2016. "It has been a fantastic journey so far in my career. There is so much to learn not just from senior players in the team but also from Janneke (Analytical Coach, Indian Women's Team) who herself is an Olympic Gold medallist. There are many instances when we quiz her about her career and experience in hockey," expressed Udita.

Speaking about practicing in the National Coaching Camp prior to the tour of Argentina, Udita said every player made progress. She reflected on the challenging circumstances when they were restricted indoors and had to keep up with their fitness routine. "I think every sports person has had to face various challenges due to the pandemic. Personally, it was quite challenging to keep up fitness both mentally and physically during the lockdown this year but thanks to incredible support and encouragement from Hockey India, the team and coaching staff, we were able to overcome the challenges."

"The months before the tour of Argentina was all about hitting the same levels we were at early in the year. We have worked extremely hard to reach the desired levels in terms of fitness and speed.

We will be able to test our progress when we play more international matches this year," she said. Udita was part of the Indian Women's Hockey Team squad which played two matches against Argentina Junior team, two matches against Argentina B team and four matches against Argentina Senior team from 17 January 2021 to 31 January 2021.

## For Junior Men's Hockey Striker S Karthi, hopes are pinned on hockey for a financially stable life

India Junior Men's team striker S Karthi, who hails from a small town named Ariyalur, which is about 350 km away from Chennai, made a career choice of playing hockey at a very young age. A series of scintillating performances for the Hockey Unit of Tamil Nadu in the 2018 Hockey Junior National Championships earned him a call-up for India Colts Camp.

Currently a part of the Junior Men's Core Probables, Karthi comes from a difficult economic background, who believes that a successful career in hockey will ensure him a job and financial stability back home for his family.

"My father works as a watchman at a government college for a salary of Rs 5,000 a month. I have an elder sister who is married and a younger brother who has completed his 12th standard. I am aware that there have been many players in the Indian team who have come from very difficult financial background and I am no different, but hockey has helped them come up in life. They have a good job and recognition because of hockey.

"My goal too like every other player is to play for India and I am working hard to earn a place in the Junior India team," said the 19-year-old striker who admires his senior compatriot Harmanpreet Singh for his drag-flicking abilities.

Getting affected financially by the pandemic, Karthi had to work part-time in a bakery as his father's meagre salary was cut further following nationwide lockdowns in 2020. While recalling the hardships faced last year, Karthi said, "I had just returned home from National Camp in March last year when the nationwide lockdown was announced. With no colleges functional, my father's salary was reduced to half leaving the family in dire need of money to make ends meet. I chose to work in a nearby bakery from 10am to 3pm to help my family meet the expenses".

However, in August 2020, Hockey India provided financial aid of Rs 10,000 to 61 of those core

probable athletes who were not holding employment. The objective of this initiative was to provide financial relief for athletes, to be able to assist them to resume sporting activities.

"This came as an immense support to me during those days. But most importantly it also made me realize that because I am a hockey player currently in the Junior core group, I was provided the financial aid. If I had not pursued hockey, I perhaps would have been doing odd jobs to earn a living. It has made me more determined to do well and earn a place in the Junior India Team and go on to a successful international career," stated Karthi.





## "Scoring five goals in Chile Tour was special," says Indian Junior Women's striker Beauty Dung Dung

Indian Junior Women's striker Beauty Dung Dung had a remarkable outing on the recently concluded Chile tour, where the team remained unbeaten. Dung Dung, who has been one of the vital cogs of the Indian junior team, scored five goals in six games on the tour including a hat-trick in the first match against the Chile Junior Team which helped set up a comfortable 5-3 win. In the following matches of the tour, Indian Juniors won 4-2, drew 2-2 and secured 2-0 and 2-1 victory against the Chile Senior Women's Team.

"Since we were playing in international matches after more than a year, we really wanted to enjoy playing every match. Last year has been particularly tough on all of us because we were not in camp for nearly eight months. During the lockdown, we couldn't practice hockey. Only in September when the MHA guidelines allowed us to resume activities, I could train at the Ekalabya Sports Hostel in Ranchi. When we were called for the Camp later that year, we were all very excited and wanted to make the most of it and trained really hard for the Chile Tour," explained the 17-year-old forward.

Beauty earned her maiden call-up for the Junior Core Group on the back of her solid performance in the 9th Hockey India Junior Women National Championship 2019 (A Div), where her team Hockey Jharkhand beat Hockey Haryana 2-1 in the Final. Soon after, she was picked in the Junior Women's squad for the Cantor Fitzgerald U21 International 4 Nations Tournament in Ireland followed by the Series in Belarus. The Jharkhand-born also took part in India's successful outing in the 3 Nation tournament in Australia.

"We have developed a very good understanding amongst each other. The core group is led by Captain Suman who is very encouraging especially for youngsters like me in the team. In our previous camp, we also played a few matches against the Senior India team which helped us prepare well for Chile. Since we are in the same campus as the Senior core group, we watch how they press, the skills they use and set pieces they create. We often tell ourselves, if they can play so well, then why can't we," expressed Beauty, who lives in Karangaguri, in Simdega district, Jharkhand.

Having made a career choice of playing hockey at a very young age, Beauty was encouraged by her family and particularly by her school principal at Aarti Madhya Vidyalaya in Karangaguri. Her compatriots from the same village Sangeeta Kumari and Sushma Kumari too are part of the Junior India squad. Currently a part of the Women's
